

Maintenance	Share of cost of activities required to maintain the site and the cemetery (this should include perpetual maintenance if offered by the operator. Costs for renewable interment should reflect agreed tenure term)				
End of tenure costs (renewable)	Administration costs of contacting right holder to see if they want to renew
